### Flight Information

- Wasaya Airlines fly into the communities daily, it takes 1 hour and 30 minutes to fly in from Thunder Bay, Ontario.
- KEA will assist non-resident teaching staff with two return fares from the teacher's home in getting to and from Kitchenuhmaykoosib. The KEA will notify the teacher of the travel dates in August for the beginning of the school year, in December for Christmas Break with the return, and the summer flight home in June. The flights are booked to allow the teachers to arrive in the community one week before school begins in August and arrive in the community to start teaching when Christmas break is over.
- Teachers must be in the community to prepare before starting school. Travel benefit does not include the \$500 worth of freight return once in September and once in June.
