The Post Secondary Student Pathways Navigator plays a vital role in supporting post-secondary, training, and career initiatives for students in IFNA communities. This position involves mentoring on-reserve community members attending post-secondary/training institutions and fostering relationships with colleges, universities, and training programs. Reporting to the Education Director, the Navigator collaborates closely with the Education team.

### Responsibilities:

# 1. Partnership and Communication:

- Cultivate positive relationships with colleges, universities, and training institutions.
- Facilitate recruitment of post-secondary students from IFNA communities.
- Provide ongoing support to post-secondary students, including logistics and connecting them with necessary supports.
- Conduct outreach activities to raise awareness of available programs and services.
- Assist in developing post-secondary and training opportunities within communities.

### 2. Curriculum and Professional Development:

- Conduct workshops and orientation sessions addressing education and training needs.
- Ensure students are aware of and utilize available support services.
- Offer career exploration services and activities.
- Assist ongoing students with post-secondary services required for graduation.

# 3. Reporting and Coordination:

- Prepare progress reports for the Education Director.
- Participate in regular team meetings.
- Assist in report preparation and data collection for pilot programs.

#### 4. Documentation and Communication:

- Maintain accurate daily documentation.
- Enhance home/school communication by sharing relevant information effectively.

#### 5. Professional Development:

• Attend training sessions to stay updated on best practices.
